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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Jamshedpur Co-operative College, Jamshedpur is situated on the bank of river Swarnarekha towards its south in Circuit House Area of Jamshedpur, Jharkhand. The famous Jubilee Park & Zoological Park are situated towards its south east. Jamshedpur is well connected with other cities of Jharkhand & nearby States- Orissa, West-Bengal, Bihar etc.

The Jamshedpur Co-operative College, Jamshedpur was established by great social worker & visionary; Mr. M.D. Madan, who had initiated the foundation of this college dates back to September 1, 1949. Jamshedpur Co-operative College is a Constituent unit of Kolhan University, Chaibasa. With a sprawling campus of 36.63 acres, with seven huge building blocks, three play grounds, quarters for teaching and non-teaching staff. There is one hostel for students (SC/ST) with around 100 seats. A well equipped library has a double storied reading room for 150 students having all basic facilities. The campus has a canteen and common room one each for boys & girls. The Multipurpose Examination Hall having more than 1000 capacity is sufficient for organising conferences, cultural activities and other fests. The entire campus is shaded with lush green trees and reflects an aesthetic sense all around catering to the intellectual and professional needs of the society.

The College has been trying & striving hard to meet the academic, intellectual and professional needs of the students and signing MoU with several institutions to compete with the contemporary world. Ten PG & eighteen UG Programs including Vocational Courses (BBA, BCA, B.Sc IT, B. Ed.) are running currently. Approximately six thousand students are enrolled in this institution. The IGNOU Study Centre is running since 2002 with 33 courses of UG, PG, Diploma and Certificate courses. The 37 Jharkhand Battalion NCC Coy 1 since 1960 as well as 2 units of NSS since years are running here.

The different departments are also involved in research activities and which has been arranging Seminars, Conferences, Webinars, FDPs like Career Advancement courses.

The mainstay of the institution has been to lead a wholesome life by nurturing in students the human qualities as well as professional abilities to emerge as informed and responsible citizens.

Vision

Our vision is to impart value based education with a message to the students to learn skills and life strategies for better survival and for leading a respectable and quality life with moral values as also envisaged in NEP-2020. Our vision is to equip mind-set for start-up and pick-up new challenges in the contemporary world. 1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

The strength of any educational institution can be evaluated based on various factors such as the quality of education provided, faculty expertise and experience, availability of resources, research facilities, student support services, and placement opportunities.

- Jamshedpur Co-operative college is the pioneer institution offering quality education to the students from the older era to current times, it exists as a great pillar of providing quality education to the students.
- College is centrally located with a remarkable infrastructure with a sprawling campus of 36.63 acres of land, with seven huge blocks of buildings, three play grounds and quarters for teaching staffs and non-teaching staffs. There is one hostel for students (SC/ST) with around 100 seats. Campus is full of green plantation contributing to an environment friendly area.
- Students can pursue Graduate and Post graduate programs in various discipline such as Arts Science, Commerce, Management, Information Technology, Computer Application & Education etc. It has a team of highly qualified & experienced faculty members who are dedicated towards overall personality development of students as well as of the college.
- Student support and progression is one of the major focus of the college. College gives platform to students to develop well sounded personality through co- curricular activities, cultural programs, community services initiatives like NCC & NSS etc.
- The College also offers various facilities such as library, computer lab, sports facilities, boys & girls' common room, post office, common services center, ATM, canteen, various committees and cells to provide students with holistic learning experience.
- College also has significant contribution towards environment and sustainability. College has an E-waste management program, solar power generation system, vermicompost manufacturing area, roof top rain water harvesting system and promotion of LED bulbs usage.
- The institution has installed twin dustbins for the disposal of its dry and wet wastes.
- The college has a strong alumni network which show the glory of the college through their significant contributions in their respective fields

Overall the strength of Jamshedpur Co-operative college lies in its commitment to provide quality education, dedicated faculties and various students support services which help student to achieve their goal.

Institutional Weakness

Some of the common weaknesses of Jamshedpur Co-operative College, Jamshedpur:

- College does not have sufficient faculty members.
- The Student/ Teacher ratio is low in some of the departments.
- More research projects and research consultancy need to be undertaken.
- Advance research needs funding from state & national organizations.
- Hostel accommodation for girls has to be developed along with more hostel for boys.
- The involvement of alumni in development of the institution needs to be increased.
- College needs to improve the industry- institution interface can be enhanced further.

Institutional Opportunity

Jamshedpur Co-operative College, located in the city of Jamshedpur in Jharkhand, offers a variety of opportunities for its students. Some of the opportunities available to students at the college are:

- Several Industrial complex & industries are located in the vicinity of the college providing job opportunities to the students.
- Placement and counselling is conveniently accomplished due to presence of a number of industrial units
- students of science and other streams have tremendous scope for industrial and field tours.
- The vast campus of the college make it convenient to develop eco-friendly environment.
- The local students help in preserving native tribal culture and heritage.
- Collaborating with R&D institutions and industries becomes convenient.
- Encouraging faculty members for applying to funding agency for research grant.
- Strengthening interaction with alumni association & taking their support

Institutional Challenge

There are several challenges that Jamshedpur Co-operative College in Jamshedpur may face. Some of them are:

- Fund crunch in the modernization of science laboratories and infrastructural facilities.
- Connectivity through buses, private and public transport to the college is poor.
- Poor attendance of economically poor students is due to meagre transport facilities.
- Untimely publication of results affects the academic session.
- Insufficient teaching and non-teaching staff.
- Lesser visit of outside companies for counselling and placements.
- Poor student teacher ratio but high gross enrollment ratio (GER) affects the quality of education.
- Frequent interference by the student organizations in the day-to-day functioning.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Curriculum is an integral & important part of any institution. Implementation of curriculum, flexibility, enrichment of the course is the pillar of any institution to progress for a good teaching & learning process.

- Jamshedpur Co-operative college is the constituent unit of Kolhan University, Chaibasa. The Institution follows the curriculum and academic calendar designed by University, The Master Routine is designed by the Routine Committee of the college under the chairmanship of the Principal.
- Teachers train the students to use different learning resources, give assignments, provide internal assessment for effective teaching learning module.
- Different departments arrange extra classes and tutorial classes for the students with special focus on the slow learners. The teachers also mentor the students inside and outside the classroom.
- Many of the senior teachers are members of Boards of studies and Boards of Examiners of the Kolhan University which pay major role in curriculum planning.
- The academic flexibility is ensured as Choice Based Credit System is introduced in 2017. The college also implemented NEP-2020 from academic session 2022-23. NEP-2020 itself sets the vision of developing an equitable and vibrant knowledge society by providing quality education to all with a sense of nativeness.
- The college has diverse range of course options catering to diverse range of learners in terms of core, elective paper options and vocational courses.
- College has taken initiatives to adopt Outcome Based Education Approach. Well defined Program Outcomes (POs), Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs) and Course Outcomes (COs) are significant features of curriculum.
- Conventional chalk – talk method coupled with ICT teaching pedagogy is followed in the college. Assignments, student seminars, worksheets, field visits, industry visits, invited lectures from industry and research institutions are organized for student – centred learning methods.
- Course ensures to integrate crosscutting issues relevant to professional ethics, gender, human values, environment, and sustainability into the curriculum which is an important step towards creating a well-rounded education for students.

- At college, education is communicative at both the ends, due to its feedback system. Feedback is taken from all the stakeholders, the data is compiled, analysed & action taken. The IQAC encourages departments to undertake self-assessment to improve.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

Teaching learning & evaluation of the college includes diversity of enrolled students, process to be follow in teaching learning process, process of evaluation of the students and their performance outcome.

- Jamshedpur Co-operative College is a pioneer institute which has currently enrolment of more than six thousand students. The college also ensures the diversity in its socio-economic environment owing to its students which are from diverse socio-economic backgrounds some of which are from outside the state.
- To achieve quality education interactive teaching learning methodology is emphasised which includes quizz, debates, field excursions, industrial visits etc. Use of modern teaching learning technologies such as digital boards, LCD, NPTEL, SWAYAM, Teaching-learning through Zoom, GoogleMeet online tool and other ICT techniques are used.
- College has a list of experienced and qualified faculties. Above 90% of faculties are holding Ph.D./NET/SET in relevant subject. Total number of research papers published in last five year are eighty & the number of books/chapters published are twenty-five.
- The assessment of performance of students is done in a transparent manner which is an integral part of teaching-learning process. The assessment of students involves following components: Internal written examination, Quizzes, Written assignment, Overall performance including regularity, Project work etc.
- Internal assessment is done at College level which is followed by external assessment through written examination conducted by Kolhan University. The grievances of students is redressed by the University through a transparent manner.
- The major program outcome imparts knowledge on basic principles of the subjects taught in UG courses while PG courses provide advance knowledge in the field of specialization in one of the subjects.
- In addition to teaching of the subject concerned the students are encouraged to participate in other co-curricular and extra-curricular activities towards their holistic development.
- The academic programs help to develop ability of critical thinking and problem-solving skills among the students. It prepares them for taking up challenging responsibilities in the areas seeking knowledge of the subject. After graduating from the College, the students are able to take up / pursue challenging career in areas of their interest.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Jamshedpur Co-operative college has adequate facilities to foster a research environment through innovative research.

- Faculties are involved in various research activities and good number of research papers and books have been published in last five years. The faculties of this college have also worked as member of Departmental Research Council (DRC), Post Graduate Research Council (PGRC), Board of Studies etc.
- Some of the teachers have also completed Minor Research Project (MRP) sponsored by UGC. A good number of teachers are also guiding scholars for Ph.D.
- The major steps taken by the College to create an ecosystem for teaching learning and transfer of

knowledge are organization of seminar and lectures, organization of quiz, poster presentation, scientific exhibition, visit to R & D Laboratory/ Industry, excursion tours, Internship, attending workshop/ seminar etc.

- Jamshedpur Co-operative College, organizes a number of extension activities which are carried out in the neighbourhood community, sensitizing students to the prevailing social issues aiming their holistic development which ensures their inclusive growth.
- The College has been awarded with "Mukhyamantri Swachh Vidyalaya Puraskar" by the Department of School Education and Literacy, Jharkhand in 2020 apart from this the NCC, NSS units & Departments of this college actively participate in extension/social activities such as blood donation, plantation, poster making, diabetes awareness program, free health check-up, awareness program for education, Swarnarekha (river) Safai Abhiyan, awareness rally for digitalization, plastic free campus, fuel saving, road safety awareness, cleanliness drives within the campus and nearby societies, voter's awareness rally, Rally commemorating 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav', awareness for protection against cyber frauds and crimes, study kits donation to school going poor children etc.
- To enhance the learning of students beyond the boundaries of the college, college has tie-ups with several reputed organizations through MoUs.
- All these steps have positive impact on the students and it developed student's community relationship, leadership skill and self-confidence of students. It also helped in cultivating hidden personality of students and created awareness among students.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Infrastructure of any institution plays a pivotal role in its development. It includes classroom and laboratories for academic teaching- learning, Girls-boys common room, playgrounds for various sports, space for cultural events, computer resource room, multi-purpose hall, seminar hall, library, ICT facilities, space for parking, canteen etc.

- The College has a well maintained, and resilient infrastructure, with an area of 36 acres of land with an extensive green campus with 24*7 security with CCTV cameras.
- There are sufficient number of classrooms of various which are well equipped with proper furniture etc.
- The administrative block of the college consists of the Principal's Office, Examination Department, General Office with facilities of computers, Printer, photocopy Machine etc.
- The college has one Multi-Purpose Examination Hall (MPEH)- cum-Auditorium and two Seminar Halls with smart boards, for academic events like conferences, seminars, co-curricular and cultural activities.
- There are two common rooms, separate washrooms, and fresh drinking water for boys and girls in the campus.
- The college has a Post Office, Common Service Center (Pragya Kendra), fee collection counter of bank and ATM.

The college campus also has quarters for teaching & non-teaching staffs

- There are three play grounds for games like volley-ball, football, cricket, kabaddi and badminton.
- The College has a separate library building with well furnished comfortable chairs and tables, enough storage facility and spacious well-lit reading room for students and teachers. The Library is automated with required softwares.
- It houses more than 25,500 books and 1200 National and International Journals. About 1,089 books were purchased in last five years by the institute. Our students & teachers are active participants on National Library & Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST).
- The 2 computer laboratories are equipped with 50 computers loaded with updated Operating System.
- College is having 1Mbps Internet connection locally networked and connected through WiFi, for all teaching and non-teaching staffs, students around the clock.

The total expenditure of college included major amount incurred on maintenance of infrastructure & academic facilities which helps this institution to provide quality facilities to the students

Student Support and Progression

Jamshedpur Co-operative College is providing support, opportunities to the students. Students of the college progressed to higher education in various discipline. Progression to the placement in various industries is the major achievement of the college.

- The college extends financial support to needy students as scholarship/stipends from various government and Non-Government organizations like E-Kalyan by Govt. of Jharkhand for SC/ST/OBC students, Jyoti fellowship by TATA Steel Pvt. Ltd.
- It conducts programs and workshops to enhance the soft skills, communication skills, life skills & ICT/Computing skills of students.
- The college encourages students to pursue internship/project work during their Under Graduation & Post Graduation for experiential learning, with placement opportunities provided to the interested students.
- The college has an effective mechanism for timely redressal of student grievances. Various committees have been constituted like, Internal complaint cell, Grievance cell, Anti-ragging committee, Discipline Committee etc.
- Students of this college show progression in terms of higher education as well as placement to different era of disciplines.
- Various students are also known to clear different examinations like, State and National level, GATE, NET, SSC, etc.
- Students of this college participates in various sports, cultural & social activities which help them for their holistic development.
- National, State and University level awards and recognition are the major achievement of the college.
- The institution feels alumni as their integral part and as one of the significant stakeholders of it. Since ages the alumni of this college are informally participating in various activities and donated books to the library as well as departmental library & motivating the students by their experiences.

- Faculty members are involved as a member of Board of Studies, Departmental Research Council, Post Graduate Research Council, Senate and Syndicate of Kolhan University.
- The provision for appointment on compassionate ground has been enforced for the dependent of the expired employees.
- Grievance committee redresses the grievance of all stake holders.
- Banking, Post Office, Canteen and Common Service Centre have been developed to provide support to all.
- The BoGs, PMU and other committees like Finance, Purchase, Building and RUSA have been constituted for efficient and democratic functioning
- Student fee, State Government and UGC Funds as well as Self-financing courses are the major source of funds.
- The financial external and annual audit is done by the Registered Chartered Accountant.
- Internal Quality Assurance Cell has contributed significantly to improve the internal quality system and to assure quality in teaching–learning processes.
- An online Feedback mechanism for all the stakeholders has been introduced by IQAC.
- Webinar/Seminars/FDP/workshop for teachers & non- teaching staff for their awareness and skill development by IQAC.
- MoUs, Solar Panel & Rain Water Harvesting for environment as well as establishment of vermi-compost pit and Green Audit has been done for the institution.

Institutional preparedness for NEP

Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	<p>The Jamshedpur Co-operative College (JCC) is a constituent unit of Kolhan University (KU), Chaibasa and follows the course curriculum and academic calendar of KU. During 2017-2021 CBCS course curriculum was followed by the College for both UG and PG programs. Jamshedpur Co-operative College envisions to transform itself into a holistic multidisciplinary/ interdisciplinary institution. With a rich academic heritage and a dedicated team of faculty, as per the guidelines of KU, NEP-2020 FYUGP course curriculum has been implemented for UG program since 2022. In order to provide courses in multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary in nature, curriculum has option for students to choose their preferred combination of subjects. This is evident from the curriculum structure of the Under Graduate programmes of 4 years duration. The College offers elective courses which are interdisciplinary in nature to meet the objectives as envisaged in NEP-2020. The College is offering value added courses under NEP-2020 to make the curriculum professionally attractive. More and more interdisciplinary seminars, special lectures and workshops will be organized. The institution has been engaged in sensitizing various stake holders for NEP-2020. A Faculty Development Program (FDP) was organized at JCC on NEP-2020 during 3-8 December, 2021 towards preparation for implementation of NEP-2020 and for better outcomes from it. The College intends to impart education with Indian values for knowledge and culture. It focuses on increased creativity, innovation, and problem-solving abilities, teamwork and communication skills, besides general engagement and enjoyment of learning. We are looking forward for improved and enhanced research activities with multidisciplinary educational approach. With holistic approach, the College aims for holistic development. It aims to inculcate education in such a way that every student feels welcomed and cared for, where a safe and stimulating learning environment exists, and where a wide range of learning experiences are offered, and where good physical infrastructure and appropriate resources are available for all round personality development of students. Our goal is to achieve qualities which benefits every student as well as teachers.</p>

The Kolhan University, Chaibasa is already registered for Academic Bank of Credits. The College always follows the regulations of the Kolhan University for the implementation of Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) in view of NEP-2020.</p>

Skill development:</p>	<p>The vision and mission of Jamshedpur Cooperative College is to impart value based education with a message to the students to learn skills and life strategies for better survival and for leading a respectable and quality life with moral values as also envisaged in NEP-2020. The future belongs to those who learn more skills and combine them in creative ways. The institution intends to develop all such practices such as free coaching, inter-institutional interactions, debates etc. for skill development of the students. More training programs will be organized for skill development of the students and for entrepreneurship as well as startups so that students could develop the capabilities to become job creators rather than job seekers. They are assigned to carry out project work and it is planned to arrange for their internship in the industry. The College plans at least one vocational course to be opted by every student and promote for more such courses to be opted by the students. The institution offers vocational programs like BBA, BCA, B.Sc.IT, B.Ed at UG level . These programs are very much employment oriented. The institution is preparing to offer more vocational and certificate /diploma/add-on/ value added courses for the benefit of students and in view of NEP-2020.</p>

The curriculum has well defined learning outcome. Student centric methods such as experiential learning, use of ICT tools, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used which enhance quality of teaching learning processes. Value aided courses such as Environmental Science, Understanding India, Computer skill, Personality development, Yoga Health & Wellness are offered to the students of UG for their holistic development of the students. The College conducts internal academic audit and workshops and project work. It plans for hands on practical training, skill development, internship for better exposure of the students and making them competitive in the job market.</p>
6. Distance education/online education:	<p>The institution imparts distance education through its IGNOU (Indira Gandhi National Open University) Study Centre. At times online classes from Google Meet are organized for the students. This helps the students in continuing knowledge sharing by their teachers. Persons having knowledge in specialized fields and sitting in distant places can share their knowledge among the teachers and the students. The institution has been organizing such online classes with this objective. Online teaching began during lockdown and created a repository for e-content for the students. Teaching learning program and co-curricular activities, events, programmes are organized in blended mode on a regular basis in the college. The Institution coordinates for attending certificate courses under SWAYAM-NPTEL. The institution is going to begin Jharkhand State Open University Study Centre very soon.</p>

4.1 Physical Facilities

The Jamshedpur Co-operative College campus has a well maintained and resilient infrastructure conducive to teaching, learning and comprehensive development of students. As per the needs systematic steps are taken for up-gradation of learning resources and infrastructure. College has a striking architecture with a lush green campus of total 36.63-acre land with buildup area of eighty-one thousand four hundred twenty-five-meter square. The college campus is well equipped with CCTV camera surveillance. There are 36 classrooms of different capacities are available to meet the requirements of UG and PG students. Each classroom is equipped with appropriate, comfortable furniture with good ventilation and adequate lightning system.

The Departments are equipped with Computer, Printer, Smart Board, LCD Projectors etc. which are being used in the teaching and learning process for the students. Science departments have adequate number of laboratories which are well equipped with different instruments, glassware, specimens etc. In Vocational Courses (BCA, BBA & B.Sc. IT) there are two computer labs available for the students. These labs have adequate number of computers with required software, internet connectivity and projectors to support practical sessions and different academic activities. The B.Ed. department has also adequate infrastructure and physical facilities.

The Administrative Block of the college consists of the Principal's Office, Examination Department of the College, the General Office, which are equipped with computers, printer, xerox machine. Principal office is well supported by good and efficient non-teaching staff. The college has one magnificent multi-purpose examination hall cum auditorium and two halls for academic events like conferences, seminars, invited lectures etc. with capacities around 100 people with smart board, 65 inches screen (for presentation), podium with mic. There are two common rooms, one each for boys and girls. Provision of fresh drinking water and separate washrooms for boys and girls are available in the campus. The college has a Post Office, Common Service Centre, Fee Collection counter of Bank and ATM facility for staff and students.

The college offers resourceful infrastructure for holistic growth of students and enhance their co and extracurricular skills. A spacious Multipurpose Examination Hall (MPEH), well equipped with an auditorium, having sitting capacity of more than 1000 students is available to organize various co-curricular, recreational and cultural activities.

The college campus also has three play grounds. The institution has adequate facilities for indoor and outdoor games. The outdoor facilities comprise of volley-ball, football, cricket, kabaddi and badminton. The students of the college participate in the Inter- College sports competitions and college also organize inter-college sports tournament regularly.

The college has 50 computer systems in Lab equipped with Scanner, Laser Printer, Photocopy Machine, UPS, Air Conditioner for the academic purpose. The departments of the college are also equipped with computer and printers which at a time can also be used for academic purpose with the help of projectors. The computers are having all the software needed for the academic purpose. It helps the students to get the idea of software, hardware and subject knowledge.

Computer in the labs is equipped with Internet facility. These facilities meet all the necessities of the students as well as the growing technological trends.

The College is having 7 out of 40 total number of classrooms with traditional lecture style teaching space that has available technological equipment which can be used to aid and enhance instruction in conduct of the course. Those classrooms are equipped with ultra HD resolution interactive displays having Windows 10, Android 7, and Android 9 operating systems. The class rooms are provided with wireless access points for the students to make use of internet. Also there is a computer system in every department with internet connection for the use of teachers.

Apart from classrooms, the college also has a Conference Hall named “Swami Vivekanand Conference Hall” and a Multi -Purpose Examination Hall. The Conference Hall is equipped with an ultra HD resolution interactive display, speakers, and air conditioner. The Multi- Purpose Examination Hall is equipped with Multimedia Projectors, speakers, etc. This hall has sitting capacity of 600 students.

College is having a 1Mbps Internet connection, locally networked and connected through WI-FI. With this connection, the college is provided 1 Router, 2 Switches, 16 Access Points, and 2 outdoor Access Points. The college provides internet access to all teaching and non-teaching staffs, students round the clock which is beneficial for their educational and research needs.

The College has a functional Common Service Centre which helps in providing various IT related solutions to teaching, non-teaching staff and students of the college.

The Jamshedpur Co-operative College, Jamshedpur follows well planned and systematic strategy for fund mobilization. The college maintains a transparent and accountable financial system for effective utilization of resources for funds. Funds are received from Government through Kolhan University for salary, infrastructural development, routine recurring expenditure, culture program allowances, organizing inter-college sports and games etc.

The Board of Governors, Project Monitoring Unit, Finance Committee, Purchase Committee, Building Committee, RUSA Cell of the College coordinates fund mobilization and effective utilization of funds for infrastructure development.

Sources of Funds

- Fee collected from students through online mode.
- Financial assistance from the Government and University.
- Funds from UGC.
- Income from self-financing courses

Utilization of Funds

- The Head of the concern department and other teaching and non-teaching staff give application to the Principal regarding the items and equipment required. The Purchase and Sales Committee which after its approval send it to Quotation and Tender Committee. The Quotation and Tender Committee either invites quotations or place tender for the purchase of items depending upon the amount involved in the procurement of the item.
- The Purchase and Finance Committee follows the General Financial Rules (GFR-2017) and Jharkhand Financial Rules for effective and optimum utilization of funds to procure goods/services. All purchases are done through Government e-Marketplace through GeM Portal. If any item in

unavailable on GeM then the GFR-2017 procedure for procurement is followed. The bills are processed through an established system.

- For the utilization of Government and University fund, the directives and rules as well as regulations contained in the Statute of HRD & University are followed.
- In the beginning of each financial year, Budget of Salary and recurring and non-recurring expenditures is prepared by the accounts section and the same is approved after a detailed discussion in the Finance Committee and is then submitted to the University for its approval and its subsequent a transmission to the Director, H&TED, Government of Jharkhand.
- Salaries and remunerations etc. are paid / released via NEFT/RTGS after proper verification and scrutiny and finally approval by the Principal.
- The fund is utilized under different heads as per the requirement of the department, teaching as well as non-teaching staff and students.

Financial Audits

- All daily transactions are cleared by the Dealing Assistant, Section Officer and verified by the Accountant and Income Bursar.
- The internal audit of books of accounts is done by the Accountant, Income Bursar and Expenditure Bursar regularly.
- The external and annual audits are carried out by the registered Chartered Accountant.

Promoting online system of Teaching –Learning process

In the last couple of years, the whole world faced the crises and consequences imposed on us due to covid-19. Covid-19 brought out a drastic change in the educational system not only in India but rather in the entire world. Universities across India as well as around the globe moved to the virtual classes suspending physical classrooms.

The main objective of the practice is: -

- To introduce advanced technology in teaching and learning process to make the teaching and learning process simple and more effective
- To make student centric approach in teaching and learning process
- To make all communications simple, fast and user friendly
- To encourage teachers to adapt to technological advancements including ICT adoption in class room teaching, learning and evaluation process
- To improve the digital literacy and digital skills of the students.
- Changing the traditional mode of teaching learning to innovative methods.
- Increasing the student's participation.
- To ensure the completion of syllabus according to the academic planner of each department
- To enhance the digital infrastructure of the campus to promote online learning and shift into a paperless campus

Problems like Covid -19 pandemic created lot of challenges in front of educational institutes. The teaching learning process became tough and challenging those days. The Institution decided to continue the classes and complete the courses for the students during the lock down period through online mode using digital content, ICT tools etc.

The students of the college hail from different socio-economic circumstances, so they have no or little internet/cyber accessibility. So, college faculties also provide pdf and written material to the students. The college selected Google meet and Google Classroom platform to carry forward the classes for the digital learning purpose. Each semester has been a classroom space and specified WhatsApp group to notify about classes and materials.

Faculties created YouTube channel and upload their Video Lectures. These YouTube videos, Question bank and Other Study material like notes etc., are uploaded on institute website through which all the students can get the easy access.

All the Departments of Jamshedpur Co-Operative College has arranged different national and international

webinars. Special Lectures were organized by the institution for stress management, health & hygiene and immune boosting diets to improve health and manage stress among the students, teachers and non-teaching staff during the pandemic. Moral Lectures were also organized for the students to creating more civilized society. This practice leads to following benefits:

- Entire teaching & learning process is through online, the students can access the contents anytime and anywhere.
- Sharing of resources is easy and maximum utilization is observed.
- The students have gained technical skills and ICT literacy has improved among the students and faculty members.
- Faculty members are capable enough to change a physical classroom into an online platform for education where every student is motivated to participate and learn with the help of technology
- The academic results are also improved
- The official communications are made easy and user friendly
- Usage of paper has been reduced

In addition to normal theory and practical classes, the faculties are involved in taking tutorial classes for slow learners. They are assigned with doing project work in UG and PG programs as a part of their course curriculum. In addition to teaching of the subject concerned, the students are encouraged to participate in other co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, extension services helping their holistic development. After graduating from the College, the students are able to take up challenging career in the area of their interest and contribute to the society.
